O presente curso tem por objetivo central discutir o tema do papel do Estado no contexto das transformações que vêm marcando a economia mundial nesta dobra de século.

Nesse sentido, o curso estará desdobrado em três unidades: a primeira será dedicada ao tema da natureza dos vínculos entre Estado e capitalismo, focalizando-o numa perspectiva histórico-estrutural. Nesta parte, serão salientados, entre outros, dois aspectos fundamentais: as limitações à autonomia do Estado estabelecidas pelo processo de acumulação e a coexistência permanente de uma economia mundialmente integrada e uma estrutura de poder descentralizada, sob a forma de um sistema de Estados, sob o capitalismo.

Na segunda unidade, serão revistas algumas das principais teses sobre o tema da globalização do capitalismo. Passando em revista alguns aspectos centrais da organização da economia mundial do pós guerra e de suas transformações mais recentes, esta unidade termina por focalizar o tema do impacto de tais mudanças no papel do Estado no mundo contemporâneo.

A parte final estará voltada para o exame de alguns processos emergentes e para o mapeamento de problemas novos suscitados naquele campo de reflexão pelas mudanças estruturais em questão. Nesta última parte, o problema da democracia -- que perpassa toda a temática do curso -- aparecerá por inteiro, em toda sua centralidade.

A avaliação será feita com base na participação do estudante ao longo do curso e em trabalho (s) sobre a temática nele versada.
